She attended Fairfax High School and then UCLA, where she met her husband and best friend for 48 years, Sydney. Together they raised three wonderful children who have since blessed her with six grandchildren, celebrated life, and cherished family and friends.

Sydney, a prominent attorney, and Audrey strongly believed that success and financial reward were meaningful only if devotedly put to the improvement of others. For close to five decades, they were major leaders in the Los Angeles philanthropic community. When Sydney died of leukemia in 1996, Audrey took on the full commitment to ensure that their efforts on behalf of others would continue.
